Each day, 780,000 police officers across our country put a badge on and go to work knowing the situations they may face are extremely dangerous.

On average, between 105 and 203 officers die in the line of duty, 50,000 officers are assaulted in the line of duty, 14,000 officers are injured in the line of duty, and over 300 officers commit suicide each year. There is no other profession in the world, except possibly the military, where you will find these kinds of statistics.

In 2019, 134 law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty. In Tennessee, 9 officers lost their lives in the line of duty in 2019. This total has increased since 2018; when there was 1 officer killed in the line of duty in Tennessee.

Farmer; sister-in-law, Elizabeth Hudson; mother and father-in-law, Donna and Ray Hudson; and grandparents, Darrel and Lola Bristol.



There are approximately 500 officers working in Sumner County, Tennessee. These officers come from cities like Portland, White House, Westmoreland, Hendersonville, Gallatin, Goodlettsville, Sumner County Sheriff's Office, and Tennessee Highway Patrol.
